"In February, New Orleans will host two spectacular events: NBA All Star Weekend and Mardi Gras. To escape the chaos, I will start the day at Rouler, a bicycle shop and café. It's named after a man who declared his property a sovereign nation, meant to celebrate creativity and the craft of handmade bikes. I like to swing by Studio Be, a 35,000-square-foot warehouse-turned-exhibition space, founded by activist-artist Brandan Odums. Since I eat out every meal, one of my go-to spots is Bacchanal, a wine shop and restaurant with live music daily. It's at its bohemian best on Monday nights, when Belgian cellist Helen Gillet plays a mesmerizing set.

Before the Mardi Gras festivities hit full stride, I will be in Malibu, California. Its raw

nature is the perfect complement to New Orleans, and falling asleep to the sound of the Pacific Ocean at the Malibu Beach Inn is hypnotic. While there, I'll reunite with my partner in design crime, the interior designer L.M. Pagano. We'll probably drive up the Pacific Coast Highway in her convertible to Old Place Cornell Winery, a soulful, rustic shack on Mulholland, run by good people who love the land. Before heading back to the beach, I'll scoop up my brother Jim, a filmmaker who recently won a Grand Jury Prize at Sundance, for dinner at Pace Restaurant in Laurel Canyon. It's close to Lookout Mountain, famously the hangout of musicians like Joni Mitchell in the 1970s. On the right night, I swear you can hear the echoes of an acoustic guitar."
